Essential Vocal Tremor: A Clinical Variant of Essential Tremor

A 20 years old male presented to ENT OPD with the complaint of change in voice since 4-5 years. A routine laryngoscopic examination revealed normal laryngeal structure and function. The patient was further referred to the Voice & Deglutology Unit of the ENT department. After a detailed investigation of the voice using acoustic and videostroboscopic examination, the patient was diagnosed with Essential Vocal Tremors (EVT). The vocal characteristics noted include rhythmic alterations of pitch and loudness that give the voice a quavery quality. It was observed in the stroboscopy that the larynx was moving vertically in concert with voice arrests. Other symptoms included voice instability, increased vocal effort during speech, weakness, hoarseness, difficulty increasing vocal volume, difficulty in being understood over background noised or on the phone, and neck discomfort during vocalization. The tremor has been reported to become worse with increased emotional stress, physical fatigue. It is important to differentiate between EVT and other conditions that include tremor as a component, such as spasmodic dysphonia, Parkinson's disease, and cerebellar disease. It is important to understand that neither treatment cures the tremor, but simply helps with its symptoms. Patients with organic voice tremor do not recover from the condition. They must learn to adapt or compensate for speech and voice deficits. Propranolol is the only drug approved by the FDA for ET. It is a nonselective beta-blocker that has shown tremor reduction of up to 50%. Propranolol is useful in reduction of tremor amplitude, but not frequency in mild cases of EVT. Along with voice therapy, there can be significant improvement in the condition with a better quality of life.


Case Scenario Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD)

Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD)

O1 - What are obsessions?

 Obsessions are recurrent and Persistent thoughts/impulses or images that cause distressing emotions such as anxiety or disgust.

Q2 - Typical obsessions?

· It includes excessive concern about contamination or harm, the need for symmetry or forbidden sexual or religious thoughts.

Q3 - What are Compulsions?

 Compulsions are repetitive behaviors or mental acts that a person feel driven to perform in response to an obsession to reduce distress.

Q4 - Common Compulsions?

- Common Compulsions are:
 - ☑ Cleaning
 - ☑ Repeating
 - ☑ Checking
 - Ordering and arranging
 - ☑ Mental Compulsions like counting etc.

O5 - What is OCD?

 OCD is a common, chronic and long lasting disorder in which a person has uncontrollable, recurring thoughts (obsessions) and behaviors (compulsions) that he or she feels the urge to repeat over and over.

Q6 - What are its Causes?

- Main causes are:
 - ☑ Psychoanalytic theories
 - ☑ Serotonin deficiency
 - ☑ Genetic Factors

O7 - Treatment Modalities?

- There are several modalities or methods of treatment:
 - ☑ Psychotherapy
 - ☑ Pharmacological Treatment like SSRI, S, Clomipramine
 - ☑ E.C.T.
 - ☑ Self-help and coping
 - ☑ Psychosurgery

Q8 - What is Psychosurgery?

- Psychosurgery is a type of surgery used in rare cases to treat severe mental health problems, when all other treatments have failed. These include:
 - ☑ Anterior Cingulotomy
 - ☑ Capsulotomy
 - ☑ Limbic leucotomy

These surgeries involve the separation of the frontal cortex from deep limbic structures.
