Guidelines of respective regulatory bodies will be followed.

Paper setters are required to set 2 question papers, out of which one set of question papers will be selected randomly. Each paper setter receives detailed instructions regarding the number of hours allotted to each topic of the subject in the curriculum along with the model question paper to enable him/ her to set the question paper covering the entire syllabus of the subject. Inclusion of short questions in each paper further facilitates wider coverage of syllabus in the question paper. Total secrecy will be maintained in the entire process.
